THE INTRICACIES OF A BIG CLUB

Last meeting our guest speaker was Belinda Jeffries, President Elect of the Rotary Club of Hobart. Catherine arranged the visit so that members could gain an appreciation of how a big club operates.

Belinda had been a stockbroker for some 10 years before branching out to run her own business – Back In Motion Physiotherapy- in a partnership, and for 10 years has been a Director of Cricket Tasmania. She came to Rotary after being involved with a children's Charity in Cambodia and being inspired by a guest speaker. She was subsequently invited to join Rotary and stressed the importance of a good guest speaker program in attracting members.

Belinda went on to outline some of the issues faced by a big club such as the large number of inactive members. As Membership Director she took

steps to cull 'deadwood' and reengage others. Suffice to say that the 100+ members has now been reduced to around 55 to 60 most of whom are actively engaged. The Club does not undertake small fundraising activities but rather focuses on three major events i.e. Rotary Sail Day in March nets \$20 – \$30000, Art Show in August \$20000 and the Magic Show \$30000. Aim is to maximize effort and return in a short period. In addition they are fortunate to have had benefactors who donate the proceeds for

various trusts. Proceeds are distributed by a funding committee that approves small projects with the split between domestic and international set at 60/40. Hobart Club will not apply funds to projects seeking merely top up funds. The Club needs to be the sole supporter.

Belinda then addressed membership and asked why would anyone like her want to join us. All club in Clarence are very similar, made up of 'retirees' and cook sausages. Also meeting times are terrible for the younger generation with family commitments etc. and as such lunchtime meetings are preferred. We should be looking at opportunities that can be run outside of meetings.

Editor's note: I consider there is room for both types of clubs – lunch clubs for busy and dynamic business people and dinner clubs for those who enjoy an evening out with like minded people. I doubt you can blend the two.

Also we will be providing a gazebo on the day and a sound system (Tim McC). We have also been asked to offer assistance with installing the sculptures on Tuesday 29 October 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. Anyone who can help on this day and on 2 November please inform Nigel G asap.

Members would be aware that our club has supported this project that involves seven Eastern Shore schools producing sculptures made from recyclable materials. The classes involved range from Prep/1 right through to 5/6. Some classes also worked with a buddy class so a 3/4 class with Prep/1 – meaning a large group of 60. Some 400 students have been involved.

The children have a good understanding of the recycling process, what it means for our environment and the basics of how to do it. This project has helped then gain a deeper understanding of the vast array of items we throw away that can be used alternatively.

Most of the sculptures related to either something that the children were currently studying in class, such as bugs in the bug hotel, the industrial tap and water wastage, history of the Derwent river dioramas; or were focused on the effect of waste on the environment such as the surfing turtle and the ribbed fish. Others have an environmental message, and some involved weaving and finger knitting waste yarn which proved to be very calming for children experiencing difficulties.
