Heather Chong - Deputy Mayor of the City of Clarence - What does Local Government do with my Rates?



Clarence is the second largest local government area in Tasmania. It is growing by about 1,000 people a year which is faster than previously predicted. The age profile of Clarence is: 22% under 24 - 24% over 64 - 54% between the ages of 25 and 64.

The city is projected to have an income of \$69.1m in this financial year, \$52m of this comes from rates. Over \$10m is spent on roads and footpaths annually. Clarence has 192 km of coastline. Much of Clarence's infrastructure, which was developed in the 1970s and 1980s, needs refurbishment, repair or replacement.

Issues were raised by club members during the course of the talk: -Wider footpaths would help people with mobility issues move around the community with greater ease, but this could lead to localised road problems as room for cars becomes less. The issue of foliage blocking footpaths was also raised.

Waste management consumes 17% of the council budget. Most of Clarence's recycling is sent interstate. One of the challenges is that much of Clarence's recycling is contaminated. To cleanse contaminated recycling is expensive.

A query was made about the proposed development at Kangaroo Bay. The proponents have been given time to develop their proposal. Then the question - some years ago there was a seminar for incoming councilors - Beware of the Rotary Barbecue. What does it mean?

If the council is handed some infrastructure, it must be able to provide for its depreciation over the next 10 years.

Finally, If a person is interested in a particular council issue, he or she can engage with the council on line.

It really was a most interesting talk.
