Update from our President

The random nature of the spread of Covid19 leaves us feeling we have limited control, but our general well-being and mental health is something we can do something positive about.

From our Club's perspective we plan to do this in a couple of ways:

- Firstly and most importantly, we will hold our meetings at our usual times, but using Zoom from our homes instead of face to face. Starting this Wednesday at 7pm we will meet on the first and third weeks of the month. Peter F will provide a bulletin for each meeting. Full details will be provided directly to you by those more skilled than I. As soon as we master the technology we will try to extend these meetings to include our guest speakers from their homes. As usual, our board meeting will be in the second week, also on Zoom. Clarence Sunrise members are welcome to link into these meetings if they would like.
- Secondly we will encourage every member of our Rotary family to contact one or two others by phone or email each day. The cumulative effect of this will I hope keep us all in regular contact. See Richard's contact list for people's details.
- Thirdly, as a Club we will offer to help each other when and where ever we can. If you need anything at all let us know. There are several of our members in good health plus members of Clarence Sunrise who have offered to act as couriers for those who are housebound, but you will need to let us know.
- Fourthly, as our knowledge/experience with technology grows, we will begin small Zoom chat sessions, much the same as meeting at the coffee shop, which people can opt in and out of depending on their time and interest.

We are always interested in additional ideas, but together these initiatives should keep our Club strong over a considerable time. It won't be long before I am trying to induct new members over the internet!

Service outside the Club is more difficult to arrange. Some members were keen for us to look for innovative projects we could undertake. I spoke on the Club's behalf, to our local Chemist about helping with delivering medical supplies but the reply was that at this stage this was undertaken by an employee and since then Australia Post has stepped into this space. At this stage the Government is quickly moving to cover other short falls we might think of, so for the immediate future there is little scope for us to make a contribution. Given the demographics of our Club, more adventurous hands on service, like programs for kids who are in isolation, would not be safe. One service we can do for our local community is to shop local. We have some great stores in our area and they all need as much custom as we can provide. It is something we can all do. All that said, there will be opportunities into the future and we are always prepared to listen to good ideas, so if you think of something, talk about it with other Rotarians and see what others think.

While hibernation has been the order of the day, at least for the President, The Club has still been busy.

- Peter O has been experimenting on our behalf with Zoom and has had a couple of informal meetings to hone his skills. District has supported this move to Zoom and has purchased access to the program for the whole District.
- Catherine has been following up with Risdon Vale Primary about their Green House. They are keen to get going, but their plan doesn't quite match their diagram, so there is still some way to go before the ordering can proceed with any accuracy. Who knows how this will be affected by future school closures, but Catherine will follow up on our behalf.

- Nigel has successfully applied on our behalf for \$900 of District Funding to provide equipment and materials for the School Green House project. Well done Nigel!! That money will assist in making the project a success.
- Lewis has supplied endless jokes for inclusion in our bulletin. If you have some more please forward them to Peter F. Goodness knows which ones Peter will choose to publish!
- Neville and Peter M have been checking out our gazebo in the park while they maintain their clientele of Currency.






2020/21 BOOKS NOW AVAILABLE
