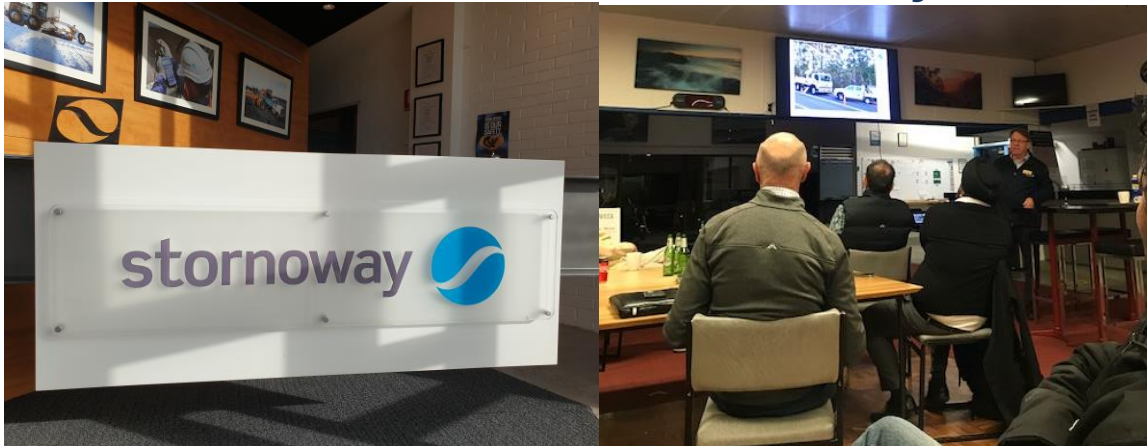




Last Meeting - Pp Peter Fitz - Stornoway - A Tasmanian Success Story



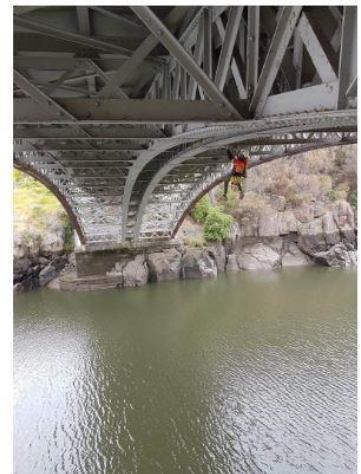
Stornoway is a Tasmanian company founded by the Gardner family in the 1970's after they discovered gravel on the family farm "Stornoway", first settled by the family in the 1890's, on the outskirts of Launceston.

Today, Stornoway turns over \$30m and employs 150 Tasmanians – it holds numerous long term contracts, including with the Department of State Growth to manage the State's South & North East road network & the Tasman, Bowen, Bridgewater & Dunalley bridges - in addition to a long term contract to manage all Hydro roads in the State.

The most "innovative" division is the Technical Services Division - a group of young engineers who can design engineered projects, work at heights, weld, perform electrical work & fly drones!

- Replacing the tray in the truck (it needs painting before the boards are secured)

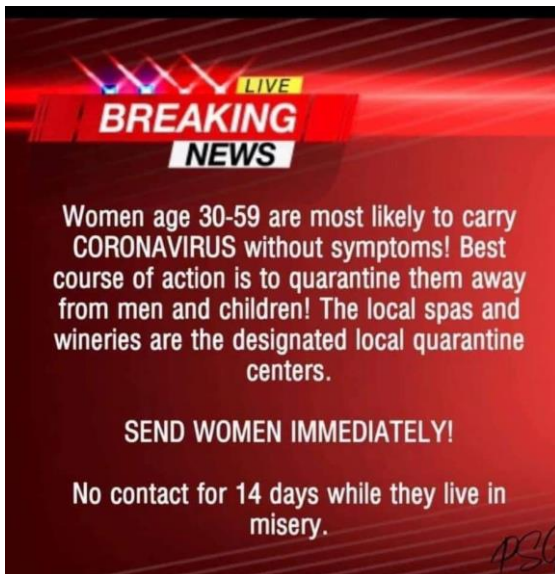
Still to come
