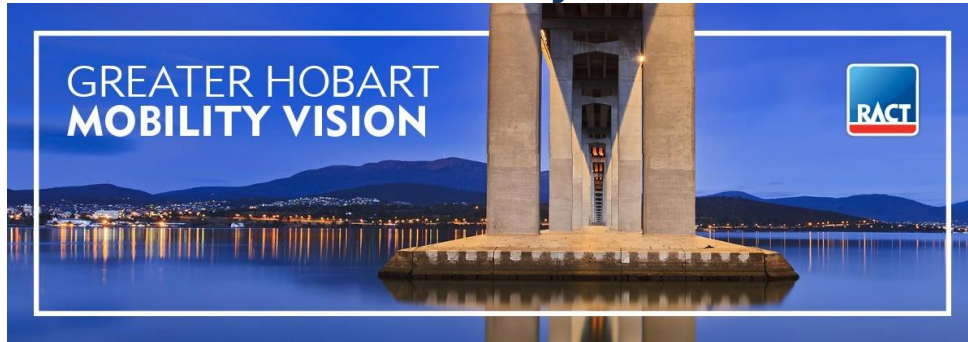
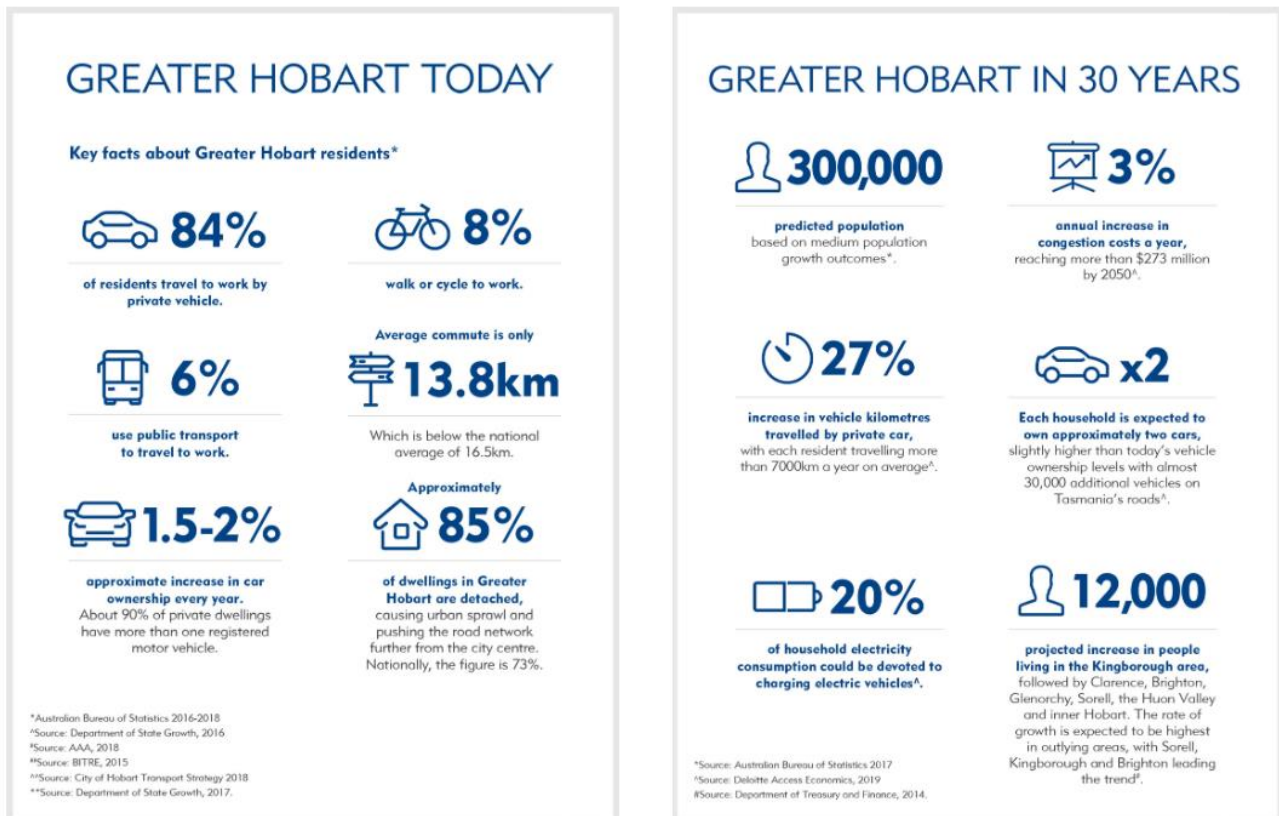




## Last Meeting - Will Oakley - RACT - Hobart 30 Year Mobility Vision

## Remuneration Guidelines for Tommy Choo Choo:

Remuneration will be negotiated in advance, however the Board can vary the following guidelines:

- If Tommy is hired out for a set time, it will be for a minimum of 3 hours. (\$150 an hour - March 2018.)
- The fare is \$5 (March 2018.)
- If fares are taken, 70% of the proceeds will go to RCOL. - the rest will go to the hiring organisation if it is a charity or school
- Private hire - all funds go to RCOL.
