

Did You Know?

Accreditation Process to become a recognised Tommy Choo Choo Driver


- The Lindisfarne Rotarian must have a valid drivers licence to drive a motor vehicle on a Tasmanian public road
- The Trainee Driver will be briefed in the set up and operation of the train by an Accredited Driver.
- The Trainee Driver will be briefed on risk assessment for use of the train
- When confident, the Trainee Driver will be provided with a supervisory drive (No passengers) with an Accredited Driver
- At a public event, the Trainee Driver will travel in the train behind the driver and talk through the issues with the Accredited Driver (with passengers on board)
- When both the Accredited Driver and Trainee Driver are happy, then the Trainee
 Driver, under supervision, will drive the train with passengers aboard
- When the Accredited Driver is confident that the Trainee Driver can operate the train unsupervised, the Trainee Driver may operate the train in a solo capacity with an Accredited Driver acting as "Guard" in the rear
- When both parties are confident in the ability of the Trainee Driver, he/she will become a probationary driver
- He/she must work at a total of three public events, driving the train under supervision, before being eligible for RCOL Accreditation
- On completion of three events the President may issue RCOL Accreditation, based on the evidence provided. If there is any dissent, the matter will be taken to the RCOL Board for determination by majority decision
- The Board decision will be final
