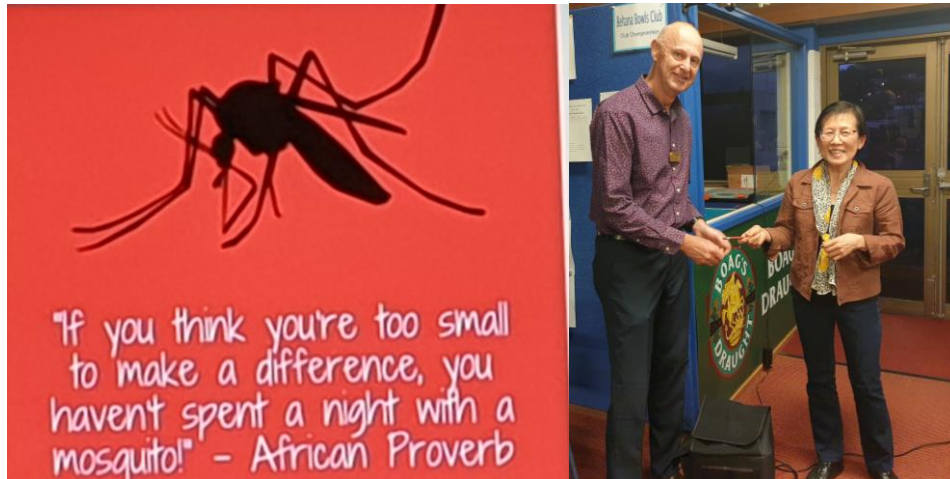





Last Meeting - Rotarians Against Malaria
