



Last Meeting - Armistice Day Commemorative Talk



One of our newest Members, Rotarian Henry, spoke about the role of the military in his family - firstly with his Grandfather who fought in WW I with the Light Horse & who survived Gallipoli – then to his father who fought in WW II as an Officer with both the British & Indian Armies – then to both his sons who are in Military Service – finally to his own 53 years in Military Service!

Henry joined in 1958, initially as a pilot but after 5 years of flying and too many ejections, he moved to Nuclear Submarines. In his mid 20's he was captaining a nuclear submarine carrying more explosive power than the total used in both WW I & WW II combined!!!

Given this background, you can imagine that the focus of the family has been very much “Service to my Country”.

When asked about the role of the Australian Military today, Henry said that it's role is to protect our way of life, by presenting a credible threat, not to initiate an attack.

Thank you Henry for a fascinating insight into Military life, delivered very professionally and with not one note in sight!

The D.O. (Director of Operations), or nominee, must inspect and approve the site where Tommy will operate.

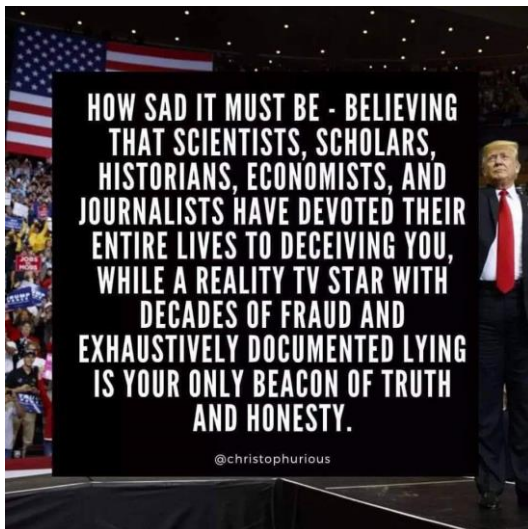
Prior to starting Tommy at the site, the operator will open the bonnet and make sure the rabbits are fed.

Remember:

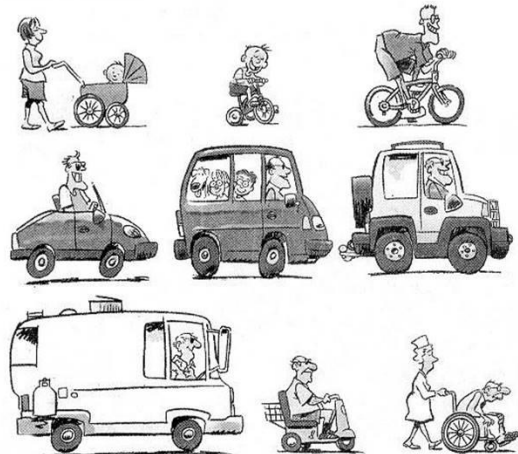
- Hungry rabbits are tired rabbits
