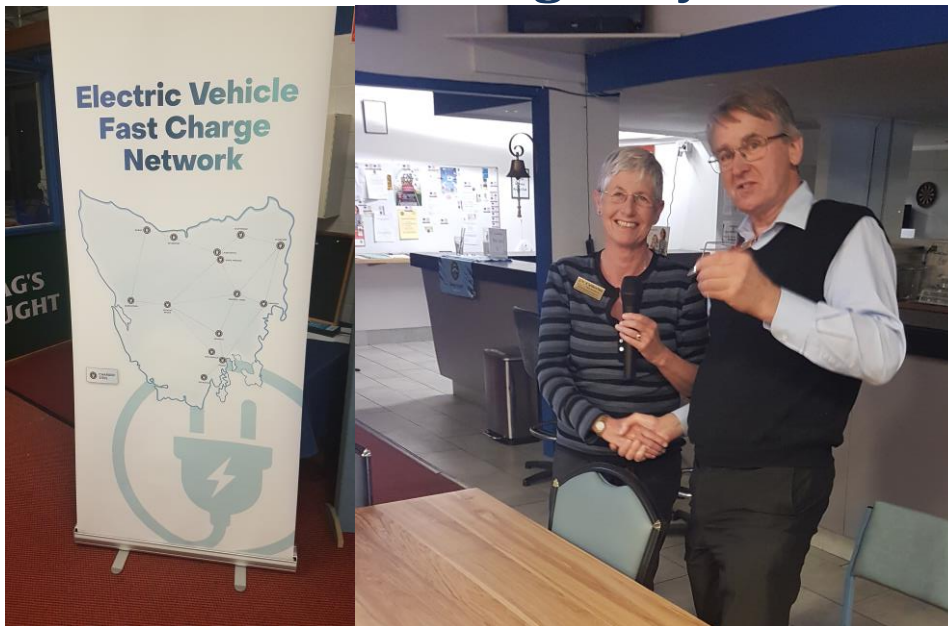




Last Meeting

They're Coming! - E-Cars & the Tasmanian Electric Highway



Clive Attwater gave a very interesting talk on E cars in Tasmania and the growing network of Hi and Low capacity charging points for them.

He said that there are about 400 E cars in the State – a number which is growing rapidly. The network of Hi Capacity Charging stations is now such that any E car with a range of 250km can easily travel around the State.

High capacity charging at a public station costs about the same as unleaded petrol and can be completed in around 10 minutes. Lo capacity can be anything from a normal home power point and these can take several hours or overnight.

Some E cars are now being fitted with a noise generator to overcome the perceived problem of them being TOO quiet!! E cars or Hybrids will progressively become common on our roads and if large corporations or the State Government decide to convert their fleets, this will in turn boost the numbers, as the used E cars later enter the re-sale market. (NB the State Govt has already committed to buying some).

Thank you Clive for a fascinating and informative insight into the automotive future.

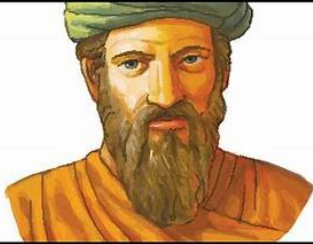

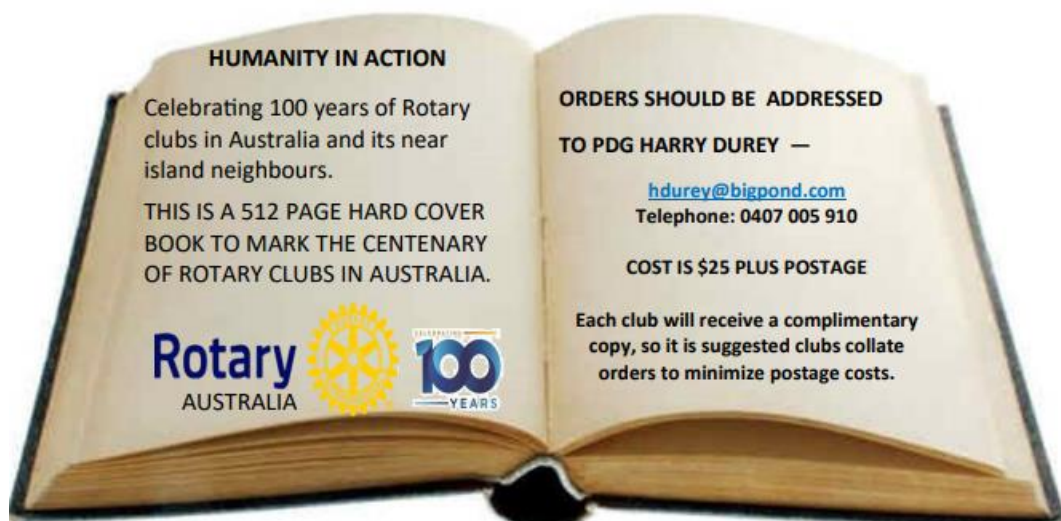
