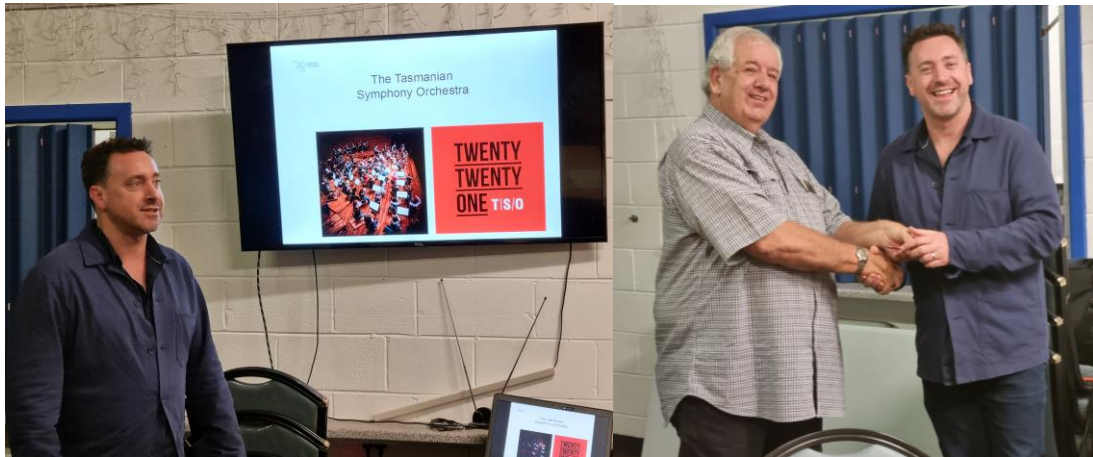




Last Meeting Sam Cairnduff - All about the TSO

Today it employs 22 staff in full time & part time Administrative roles covering Artistic Management, Operations, Business Services, Marketing & Communications.

The Orchestra consists of a 47-piece Ensemble + the TSO Chorus.

2020 was a very different year for the TSO, which brought about many changes, a number of which will be continued, particularly in the on-line, live space. The TSO created the "TSO Daily Dose" and between March & September 2020 produced & streamed 197 episodes....and so "TSO Live & On Screen" was born.
