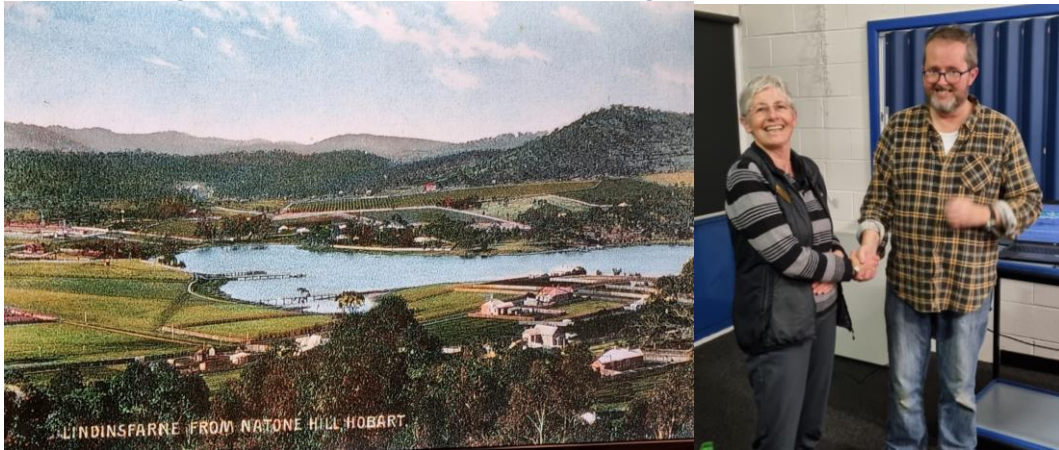

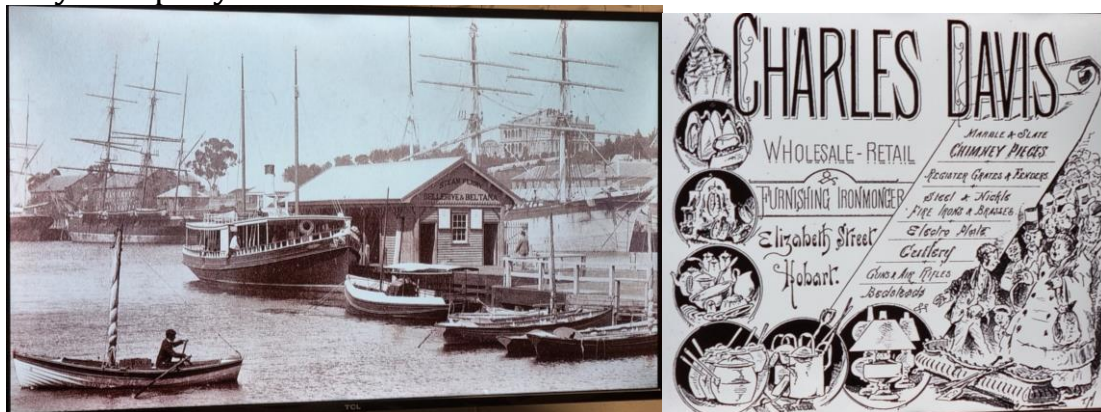
## Last Meeting Alan Thompson – Clarence City Council Cultural History Officer - History of Lindisfarne



Alan gave a fascinating talk on the history of Lindisfarne, accompanied by some wonderful old photographs & prints.

The area was originally named Lindisfarne in the 1920's after Lindisfarne House, a property near Rosny. The area was renamed Beltana in 1892 by a consortium, including Charles Davis (shop owner) & Matthew Simmons (Simmons Wolfhagen), who were looking to promote the area for subdivision as a suburb in a "peaceful & tranquil location, removed from the Town of Hobart" – they even planted rows of pine trees that still exist today, to make the subdivision look more like England!

Transport from Hobart Town was obviously a problem, so they formed the Beltana Steam Ferry Company and ran ferries from Bellerive & Beltana to Hobart Town.



Beltana was eventually renamed back to Lindisfarne, due to confusion with Beltana in South Australia, which resulted in mail being regularly mis-directed!

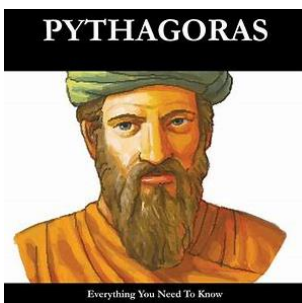

## OPERATIONS UPDATE

### Rental Crisis Hits RCOL!

For a number of years, the club has been able to store Tommy at the Hobart Showgrounds free of charge, but on the condition that we provide free rides for patrons of the show each year. This arrangement has worked very well and the club is grateful to the Royal Agricultural Society for their generosity.

This week Peter Morgan and I met with management of Hobart Showground to get an indication of when and how this years Hobart Show would run. The Hobart Show will run from the 20 – 23<sup>rd</sup> of October and we have agreed that we would again run Tommy for the patrons. This year is the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the show and as you would expect, because of COVID, it will run a little differently. The normal rides and sideshows may not be present this year. Owners of the rides are finding it very difficult to obtain insurance and indications are that Tommy may be the only ride available. This will no doubt make us both popular and very busy. Crews will be required for the 4 days, so please have a look at your diaries now and keep some time free during the show period.....**Stay Tuned**

As most of the Club will be aware, the Agricultural Society has been planning development of the site. We have been advised that a Planning Application will be submitted to council in the very near future for building of approximately 300 houses/units. The area to be developed includes the shed that Tommy is stored in and we have been told that works are likely to start in February 2022. This means that we have to find somewhere to store Tommy, the truck, and our BBQ trailer by February next year.

A number of options are being considered but at this stage we do not have a solution. Time is against us, so members are encouraged to provide any ideas to John Cole.
