Last Meeting Ann Harrison - Risdon Vale Neighbourhood Centre



Ann has lived in Risdon Vale since 1961 and has been the backbone of the Neighbourhood Centre for the last 30 years, but is retiring in October this year.

This amazing Centre enriches the local community by improving social connectedness, breaking down isolation and providing opportunities and programs for all members of the community to interact, participate and develop in a welcoming supportive environment. Their services and activities include:

The Centre operates with 74 volunteers , but has funding for just 2 full-time employees. It survives very much by applying for grants.

Ann's biggest concern for Risdon Vale is the ageing population with more that 60% over 60 - this group have become very disconnected during the COVID pandemic.



OPERATIONS UPDATE

This is normally a quiet time for Tommy and BBQ bookings, so the Operations Team

continue to meet at the Showgrounds each Wednesday to prepare for the upcoming season and to continue work on existing projects.

Sunrise Club BBQ Trailer: Last year the Sunrise Club took ownership of a BBQ trailer. After some discussion and consultation, it was decided that the trailer, in its current configuration was unsafe. Led by Ted K work has now commenced to bring the trailer to a standard where it can be used safely and where it can be handed over to the Sunrise Club. This work involves re-configuration of the internal structure and a redesign of the way the BBQ plates are used. It is expected that work will take about two months which will see the trailer ready for use by summer.


Tommy Driver Accreditation
