Last Meeting Daniel Hulme – Parenting a Child with Autism



Rotarian Daniel presented an excellent insight into family life living with a child with autism, after their first child Elliott was born in January 2017 and diagnosed with the disorder.

He discussed what the autism spectrum means and what are some of the exhibited behaviors & also dispelled a lot of the autism myths.

<p>Autism spectrum disorder</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSM-5: Persistent deficits in social and emotional behaviour: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social and emotional reciprocity • Non-verbal communicative behaviour • Developing, maintaining and understanding relationships • Restricted, repetitive patterns of behaviour, interests or activities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Repetitive movements or use of objects • Adherence to routines • Abnormally intense fixation on interests • Hyper- or hypo-reactivity to sensory input • 'Spectrum' – people with ASD have different levels of functionality 	<p>Autism myths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • People with autism cannot empathise • People with autism hate socialising • Every person with autism is a savant (like 'Rainman') • Autism is more prevalent than it used to be / autism is over-diagnosed • Autism can be cured • Autism is caused by the environment (e.g. vaccines)

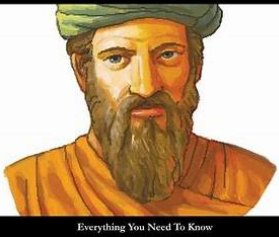

Tommy Remuneration Guidelines

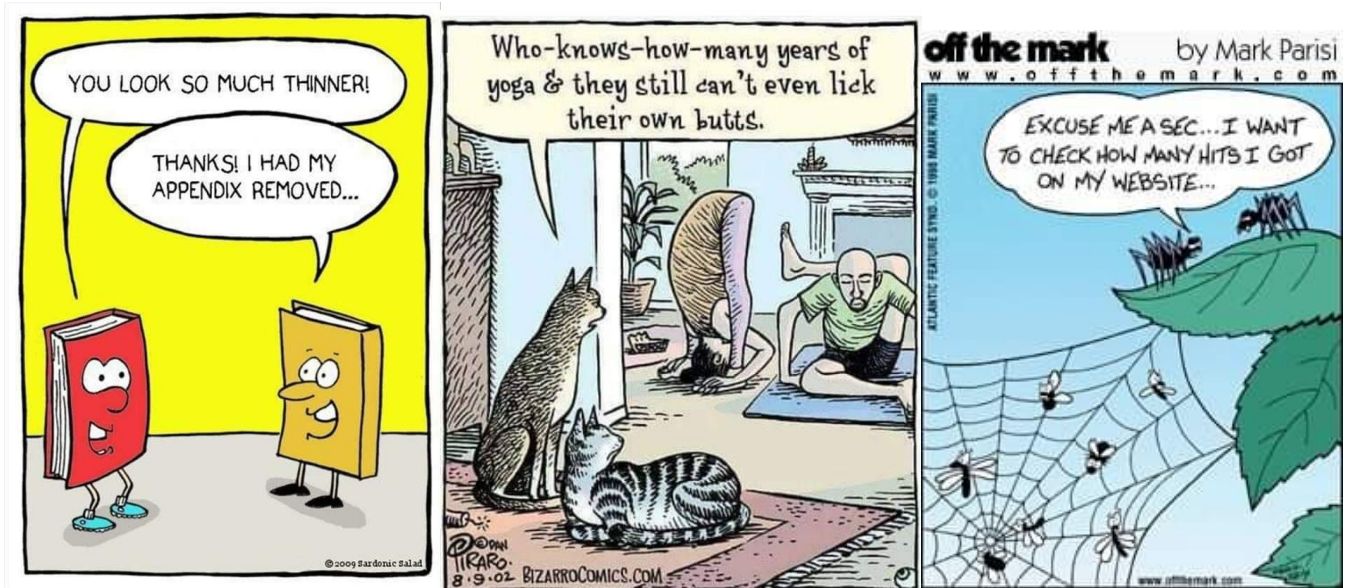
Remuneration will be negotiated in advance.
