Lets put food borne illness into perspective – what are the figures?

In Australia:

Estimated 4.1 million cases of gastroenteritis caused by contaminated food each year (making up one third of gastroenteritis cases per year);

As a result:

- 1 million visits to doctor on average each year
- 31,920 hospital admissions; and
- approximately 86 deaths.

We need:

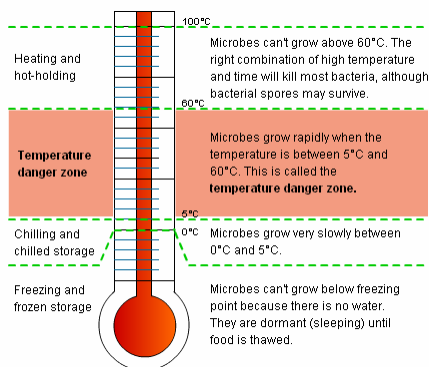
Food, Time, Heat, Moisture,

The Food Safety Standards state:



'Persons supervising or conducting food handling operations must possess the skills and knowledge in food safety and hygiene matters required to handle food safely.'



Cleaning and sanitising - what is the difference?

Food premises must be kept clean and in a sanitary state to minimise the likelihood of food becoming contaminated and to discourage pests.

Cleaning removes physical matter from the surface;

Sanitising reduces the number of micro-organisms to safe levels.

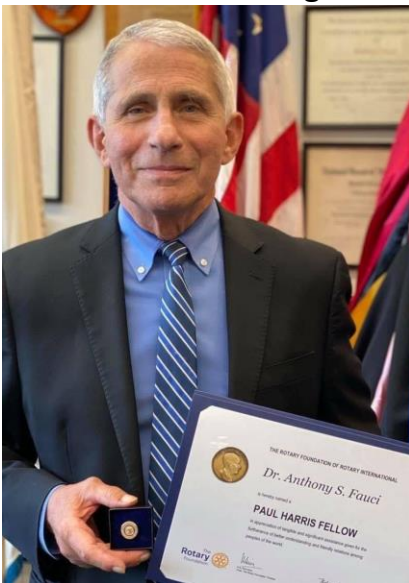
