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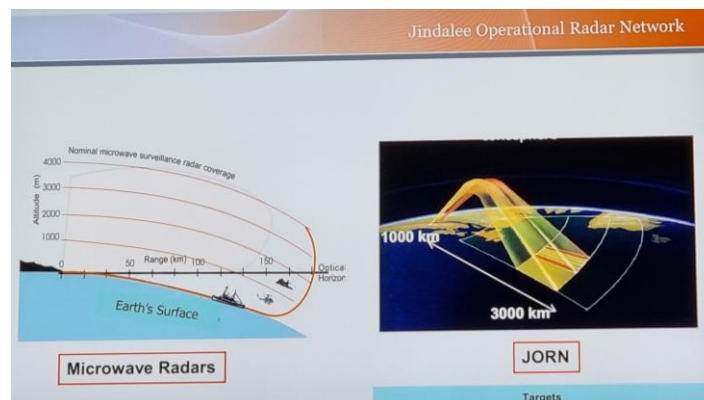
Last Meeting

Group Captain Nick Grey - Overview of Australian Wide Area & Space Surveillance Systems



The Australian Wide Area and Space Surveillance capability comprises two elements:

- Jindalee Operational Radar Network (JORN) - this consists of three Over-The-Horizon Radars based in Longreach (Queensland), Laverton (Western Australia), and Alice Springs (Northern Territory). These sites are currently maintained by BAE Systems and are remotely controlled by Air Force No 1 Remote Sensor Unit, based out of RAAF Base Edinburgh, SA.



- Space Surveillance Systems - this consists of a Radar Sensor based near the Harold. E. Holt Naval Communication Site in Western Australia and the future installation of a Space Surveillance Telescope at the same site – it is intended to increase Air Forces ability to monitor near-earth space debris and orbiting satellites.

Thank you Nick for a fascinating insight into this important, but little known, area of Australian surveillance systems.

Update from our President

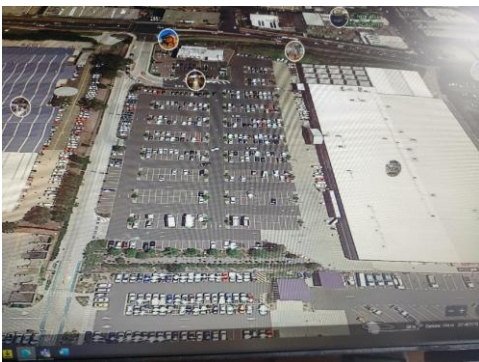

It wasn't long before he became President and also filled his International Service quota, building hospitals in New Guinea and Indonesia. I always felt if I could do half the stuff he did for Rotary, then I would do alright!

Rotary has moved on since my dad's time and thankfully we are no longer a formal businessman's club. Something that my father irked was that females and in particular my mother, was ineligible to join.

What has also moved on is how Rotary has expanded into all aspects of life. Since becoming president, which “entitles” me to receive on average five emails per day, I am realizing how little I know about Rotary!

So, in a long-winded way, what I am trying to say is that for each meeting from now on we should try to expand our knowledge by sparing five minutes to talk about some aspect of Rotary. Given we will be doing a fund raiser for Hat Day this meeting, this is a good opportunity for me to learn and talk to you about where the funds go with Australian Rotary Health.

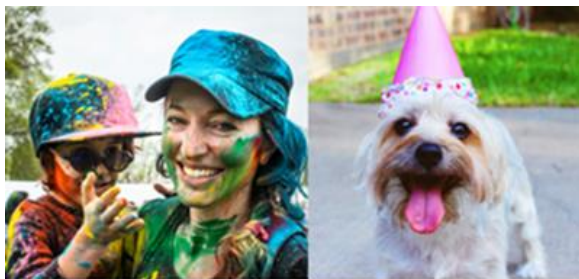
