

## **Last Meeting**

Louisa Marmion - Ageing Gracefully



Louisa talked about the musculoskeletal changes that occur with ageing & why these things happen, specifically: Osteoarthritis, Osteoporosis, Sarcopenia & age-related muscle tears and Balance deficit/increased falls risk.

She then focused on how to prevent & manage these conditions via:

- Physical activity (weightbearing for bone health)
- Strength Training including balance exercises.
- Healthy diet involving plenty of whole-grains, fruit/vegetables and calcium-rich foods.
- Avoid or guit smoking and reduce alcohol intake
- · Absorb plenty of Vitamin D







The minimum recommended exercise guidelines are:

- 150 minutes of moderate activity per week, plus 75 minutes of vigorous intensity activity where the heart & breathing rates are raised
- 2-3 strengthening sessions per week

NB Exercise should be purposeful for the above recommendations – do not count incidental exercise.
