Emily Marriott - Hobart City Mission



Hobart City Mission will celebrate it's 170th anniversary next year – an amazing achievement!

Today the Organisation has over 500 volunteers and runs 16 different programs, including:

- “Small Steps” a program for young mums aged 15-25 – this program is 100% community funded
- “DIY Dads” a program for dads who risk losing custody of their children due to being homeless
- “2019 Safe Space Program” providing immediate emergency accommodation – 50% of people through this program have moved on to permanent housing
- “Christmas Assistance Program” – last year the Mission received over 800 applications (25% up on the year before) – all applications are vetted and if approved, receive either food, food vouchers or Xmas presents

RCOL Members were invited to help in any way they could, but in particular with the preparation of the food packs on 13/14 December

Thank you Emily for your presentation, you are rightfully very passionate about the role of the Hobart City Mission within the Hobart community. Well done!

The Club's focus is to help the Community Centre for this. However, there is the opportunity for us to assist Hobart City Mission by providing labour for the packaging and dispatch of toys and food in December. It would be good if we can provide some volunteers to do this.



Finally, I never felt comfortable with our Club's lectern. I came across this one recently which I thought was perfect and I thought it would not be unreasonable to ask for a District grant to cover the purchase cost! All we need after this is a bigger bell (and maybe a bigger venue)!!



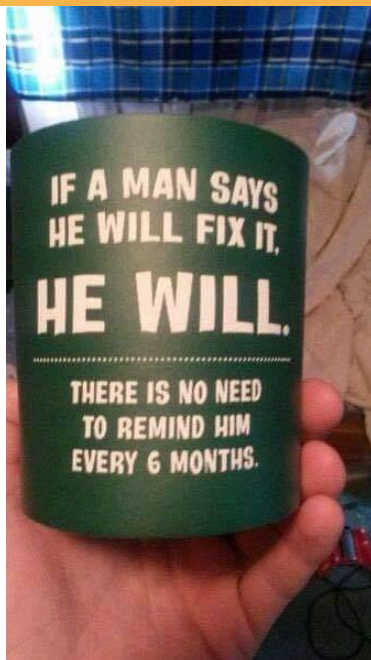
