ASSOCIATION OF UKRAINIANS IN TASMANIA



Lana has lived and worked in Tasmania for the last 7 years, working in IT.

Lana is heavily involved with the Association of Ukrainians in Tasmania, an organisation established in 1954, after the first displaced persons arrived in Tasmania following World War Two. The organisation is part of a nationwide structure, the Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations, who are working together to support those, who once again, seek refuge in Australia.

Currently the Tasmanian Association is helping and supporting 30 refugees who have arrived in Tasmania so far.

Lana spoke very passionately about the work the Association is doing to help these displaced people.

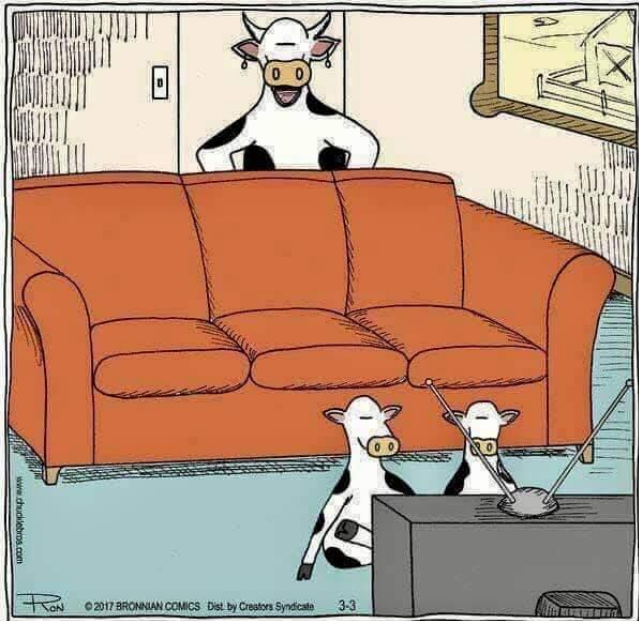
