This Meeting RCOL & Clarence Sunrise Changeover Dinner

Last Meeting
Charles Cook & Bill Oakley (Rotary Club of Sandy Bay) - Loaves &
Fishes Project





Charles spoke about "Loaves and Fishes", detailing how it had evolved out of "Second Bite", an organisation that RCOL had some involvement with a number of years ago. It is based in Devonport with a local depot in the south, in Glenorchy. They have a contract with Coles supermarkets to collect food from them, along with a number of other sources, including some farms and small restaurants and cafés.

On the N/W Coast they currently value add to the food distribution by cooking some of the produce prior to distribution and re-heating. To do this they have a chef and a commercial grade kitchen. Following successful fundraising in the south they intend to operate similar cooking facilities next year out of "The Grange Centre" in Rokeby. The aim is to provide nutritious meals to young deserving Tasmanians. RC Sandy Bay, with the assistance of other clubs and grants, has raised \$96,000 to help with this project.



Bill talked about his Jams and chutney project that is currently raising about \$15,000 a year to also assist "Loaves and Fishes". He personally cooks and prepares the Jams and chutney that are sold in a couple of Op shops and at various club meetings and events. He advised that he would be happy to supply items to

clubs for on selling at any event they ran, as long as "Loaves and Fishes" received their share.

Update from our President






The Statue of Liberty last seen walking back to France...
