Last Meeting District Governor Bob Calvert's Official Club Visit



District Governor Bob talked to the Club about the International theme ‘Imagine Rotary’ and some of his goals for the year. It’s a simple and easy to remember theme and one which allows us all to ‘Imagine’ what we as Rotarians - ‘People of Action’ can do in our everyday lives to make the World and our Communities we live in, a better place.

Additionally, the International focus on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI), heralds the ongoing need for us to look inwards at our clubs and the way they look and feel to an outsider who may be visiting for the first time.

Finally Bob talked about his District Project “Gynaecological Cancer Awareness” – supporting Tasmanian women living with gynaecological cancer. This is a Tasmanian project, with monies raised going towards funding clinical trials undertaken by the Tas Gynaecology Oncology Unit for those Tasmanian women suffering from a gynaecological cancer.

Bob Calvert at the last meeting talked about District Grants. Grants are allocated on a 50/50 contribution basis with a maximum amount of \$2,000 allocated per Grant. The deadline to submit is 31st August which doesn't leave much time. Basically, grants need to meet the criteria of helping the community (local, national or international) and not for things like replacement of our equipment. We have three ideas at this time, being annual school awards (\$500), Christmas Hampers for Risdon Vale (\$500) and a replacement of the AED in Richmond (\$1,000). Note: bracket amount is amount being applied for. If you have any other ideas of potential projects that we can apply for grants, can you let me know ASAP.

Finally, in the calendar we have it down for a planning meeting on August the 31st. My intention was to get outside help on this, which would involve a bit of pre-meeting homework for everyone. However, I may need to postpone this due to the timing of the homework and the availability of the facilitator. As an alternative, maybe we could think about booking a couple of tables for dinner at the Motor Yacht Club – if there is an interest out there?

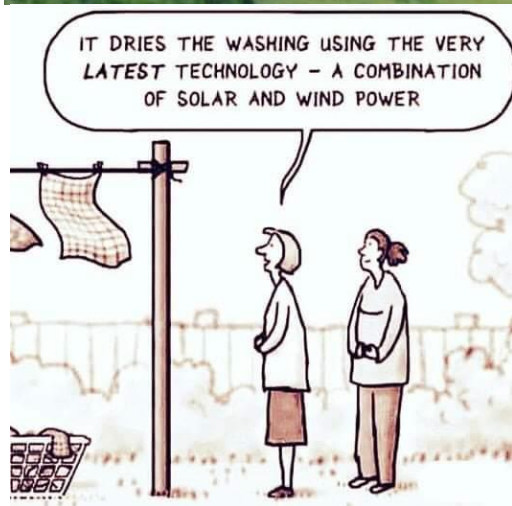
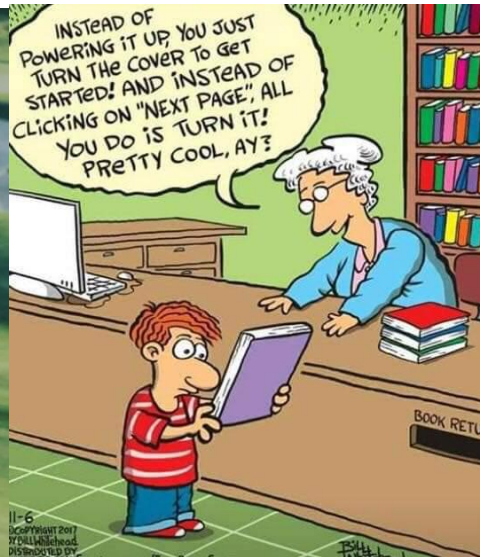
