Sue Hickey - Southern Transformation Stakeholder Liaison for UTAS – What the UTAS move to the City is all about



Sue Hickey spoke about how during her time as Mayor of Hobart, the University was focusing on centralising its operations in the city. This move had the full backing of the 12 Southern Tasmanian Councils and the State and Federal Governments of the day. Today, Sue still fully supports the transformation.

The current campus at Sandy Bay is not fit-for-purpose, requires significant rebuilding and is difficult to access for many people. Sandy Bay's incline, hillside and ageing buildings make accessibility difficult. Rebuilding Sandy Bay would make it a construction zone for a decade. Contemporary learning and teaching requires connected and collaborative spaces.

One third of the UTAS Southern Campus is already in the City. Once the move is complete, the footprint will be just 5% of the CBD. Campuses already in the City include:

- Medical Science – 1,341 students + 810 staff
- Nursing & Health – 788 students + 42 staff
- Business & Economics – 2,894 students + 208 staff
- Marine & Antarctic Studies – 811 students + 197 staff
- Media School – 440 students + 28 staff
- Fine Arts – 540 students + 76 staff
- Creative Arts & Music – 674 students + 80 staff

In addition, there are already two student accommodation complexes in the CBD, housing 906 students & 15 staff.

Sue firmly believes that the CBD move will improve access to higher education for more young Tasmanians, stimulate small business in the CBD & invest \$550 million into the Hobart economy. Thank you Sue for providing some balance to an emotional debate.

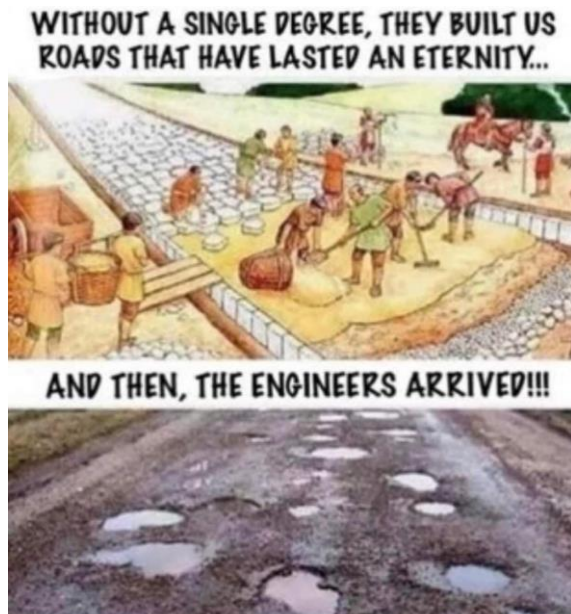

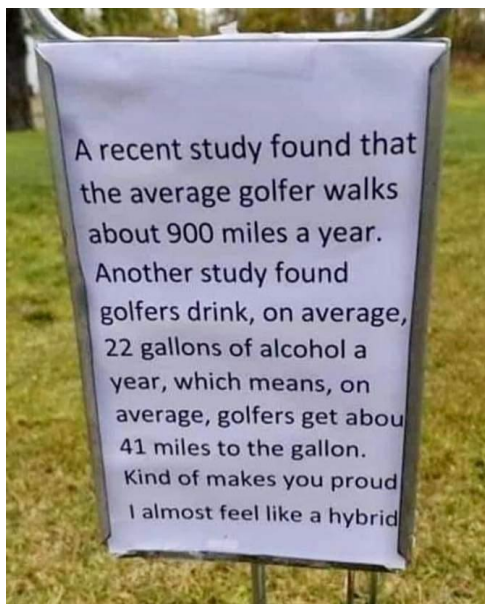
