A VIBRANT PROSPEROUS SUSTAINABLE CITY

Callan Taske of the Clarence City Council was our guest speaker last meeting. Callan discussed the idea of creating a resilient and inclusive economic plan for Clarence noting that the municipality has been the fastest growing in Southern Tasmania. The council is looking at specific strategies in key economic areas: -

- The city heart (Retail)
- Coal River Valley
- Industrial zone and
- Mornington/ Rokeby (the fastest growing areas)
- The Airport Precinct (tourism)

The strategy aims to look at a people driven approach by creating an accessible community, a place to “cherish and safeguard” the small community feel of the area, to create more jobs perhaps in IT, agriculture and marine fields, to help prevent economic leakage and to create education pathways for training.

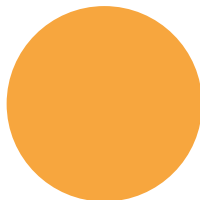
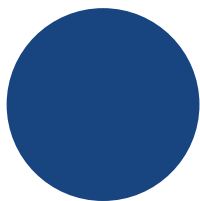
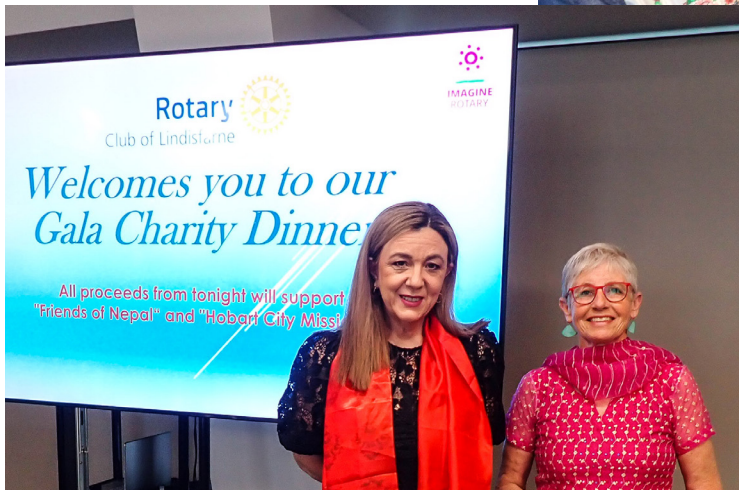
