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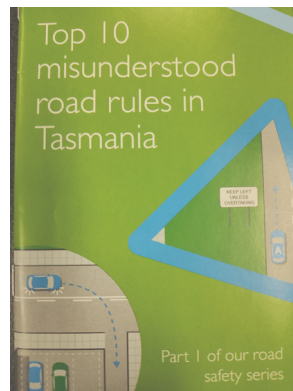

The following are some interesting and useful facts that came up during the discussion:

1. When reversing out of a parking spot, drivers should indicate to show the direction of their swing when reversing, then turn off the indicator when moving straight ahead.
2. It is essential to drive within 20km of the speed limit to avoid creating problems for other drivers.
3. When approaching and exiting a roundabout, drivers should indicate to show their intended direction, except when going straight ahead through the roundabout.

The presentation also highlighted that Tasmania has the highest death rate on the roads per head of population in Australia.

Additionally, over 500,000 animals are killed on Australian roads each year. If a driver injures an animal, they should call Bonorong Wildlife Park for assistance.
