LAST MEETING - INTERPLAST

Last meeting saw Val and Donna came alk to us about Interplast Australia.

Interplast Australia is a non-profit organization that provides lifechanging reconstructive surgery and medical training to those in need across the Asia-Pacific region. Founded in 1983, Interplast aims to improve the quality of life for individuals who are unable to access or afford essential surgical and medical care. The organisation works in partnership with local doctors, hospitals, and communities to deliver specialized surgical programs, focusing on areas such as cleft lip and palate repair, burn scar contracture release, hand surgery, and other reconstructive procedures.

Interplast's team of volunteer plastic and reconstructive surgeons, anesthetists, nurses, and allied health professionals donate their time and expertise to perform surgeries and provide comprehensive care to patients. In addition to providing surgical interventions, Interplast also focuses on capacity building by

offering training programs and mentoring opportunities to local medical professionals.

Over the last few years with the global pandemic, Interplast surgeons delivered their critical services to the targeted regions over video, assisting the local surgical partners to complete the surgery.

Interplast costs include travel, accommodation, medical supplies, local supplies, training and program administration for team members and typically totals around \$200,000 for a project to a country.

It was a well received presentation and the life-changing outcomes of the surgeries was obvious for all to see.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

The convention was held over 4 days starting on Sunday the 28th May in Melbourne.

Prior to the convention there were a number of events organised by local Rotary Clubs, such as tours to wineries, golf clubs and museums, as well as visiting local clubs.

I think there were about 15,000 members and partners of Rotary and Rotaract who attended. Over 100 Tasmanians including 4 from our club

The convention was split over two venues – Rod Laver Arena – for the General Sessions and the Melbourne Exhibition Centre for all the Breakout Sessions and the "House of Friendship"

The "House of Friendship" was a large area set up with displays from clubs and groups around the world displaying their projects and activities.

The Convention was opened by Jennifer Jones the first female President of Rotary International. She is Canadian and there was a definite Canadian accent to a number of the presentations and entertainers.

The General Sessions in Rod Laver Arena had a number of excellent speakers spread over the four days plus some excellent entertainers, all sessions were hosted by a mother daughter combination from Iceland.

Transport between the two locations was either by free trams, shuttle busses or walking.

Breakout sessions were many and varied, I went to presentations on retaining members, regionalization and a couple of others.

For those who wanted to pay extra there were also a number of specialized meals and events at night including a night at the museum and dining at Flemington Racecourse.

It was great to sit on trams full of visiting Rotarians all talking about where they came from and what they did.

All in all it was well worth the time and effort to attend – highly recommend to everyone.

The next International Convention will be in Singapore from May 25-29 2024 – the sooner you register the cheaper it is.
