Kathy showed us her photo montage from her amazing 2 month trip to Europe starting in Frankfurt, Germany then on to Stockholm, Sweden, Norway, Iceland and Scotland. Even though it was officially Spring, in the north of Europe it was still winter as evidenced by the amount of snow in Sweden, Norway and Iceland. One of highlights of the Norwegian Cruise with Hurtigruten was the dog-sledding at Tromso and while it certainly looked pretty cold the scenery was incredible. The history of Northern Europe shows how young (in European terms) our country really is. Kathy also gave a brief explanation of the impact of WWII on Norway and showed us what the Russian Border looked like.



Mike's First DG Address to the Clubs of 9830



The Rotary Centenary Playground at The Royal Hobart Hospital has been completed.

The need for a playground was identified as being integral in the redevelopment of the Hospital's new K-Block.

Funding challenges emerged and on behalf of the Central Auxilliary, President Marion Cooper stepped in to solicit support from Rotary Clubs.

The District Governor at the time, Michael Cooke (2019-2020), encouraged this as he considered it an appropriate project to celebrate the centenary of Rotary in Australia.

Funding for the project was sought from the Rotary Clubs in Southern Tasmania resulting in contributions of \$80,000. This was topped up with a grant from the Tasmanian Community Fund of \$40,000 which allowed the \$120,000 project to proceed.

With the assistance of the current District Governor, Bob Calvert (2022-2023), the playground is now ready to open.

Tourism body Destination Southern Tasmania on Wednesdaylaunched the Crave Harvest Festival, with the event to be heldon April 6-7 next year.

"Crave has been established by the Coal River Valley Tasmania Tourism Association to showcase the fantastic produce the region has to offer and the passionate people who harvestit." Destination Southern Tasmania

chief executive Alex Heroys said.
"The festival will include stalls of local producers and delicious ready-to-eat food from food vans. There will be masterclasses on topics from wine and cheese pairings to gin or whisky tasting."

Coal River Valley Tasmania

Katrina Williams said Crave

paddock of Richmond Park Estate
In Richmond.

"The Coal River Valley region has a rich history of food production and the association believes holding a food and wine festival in this region provides an opportunity to showcase both the history and culinary traditions," Ms Williamssaid.

She said there would be musical performances from local entertainers throughout the day and a family friendly kids' zone.
