## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

The Changeover Dinner held in our new venue was a most enjoyable night. There were 47 members and partners present including PDG Bob and Kay Calvert, DG Mike and Margot Patten and the Mayor of Clarence Brendan Blomely. I congratulated Stephen and his team on a job well done over the last two years and introduced the new Board members.

The Board held it first meeting last Wednesday and it was agreed that our club and the Sunrise Club will work more collaboratively especially in relation to resource sharing. Also, on reviewing the structure of the Board I have appointed Peter O'Hern to be Director Youth.

Our club is involved in many Rotary 'youth' activities and to include it under Projects reduces the focus to both.

We have a pretty full program over the next six months with BBQ's and Tommy bookings and it would be good if we can spread the load amongst all members. I also encourage members to take part in the training program that David Lowe has drawn up for Tommy that will occur on Saturday 16 September and Saturday 21 October. It is also looking hopeful that we may have found a new home for Tommy and we expect a decision on this shortly.

Next Wednesday will be our first 'normal' meeting at the MYCT and the procedure for ordering meals is outlined elsewhere in this bulletin. Please also note that our meetings will commence with the guest speaker delivering their presentation. This presents an ideal opportunity to promote our club amongst the local community particularly the MYCT and the RSL membership that has a combined membership of nearly 1000. The intention is to extend an invitation to members through the MYCT newsletter to join us to hear any presentation that may interest them. At the end of the presentation visitors may leave or stay.

Applications are now open for District grants and the amount has been raised from \$2000 to \$3000. The closing date is 31 August 23. I ask all members to think of a project/s that the Club could undertake and which would be eligible for a grant. Examples of previous grants have been: AED's for the local community, tents for Scouts, a water project in the Solomons, Risdon Vale School Kitchen Garden, and Friends of Nepal education scholarships On 1 August I will be meeting with AG Peter Fitzgerald and the other Group 2 Club Presidents where I will be looking for opportunities whereby the clubs can work together to achieve greater outcomes.



# **Rotary's new Governor**

LINDISFARNE Rotarian Mike Patten has been installed as District Governor for the 46 Rotary clubs in Tasmania for the upcoming year.

Mr Patten and his wife Margot are both former presidents of the Rotary Club of Lindisfarne and have been advocates for the modernisation of Rotary, including the support of diversity, equity and inclusion.

Mr Patten said this appointment, which is for one year from 1 July, was the result of decades of hard work and involvement with Rotary clubs and other volunteer organisations in Tasmania.

"I've been a member of the Rotary Club of Lindisfarne since 2000 and in the past two decades I've supported both my own club and others across the state," he said.

"I've had experience with multiple state-wide volunteer groups including six years as chief commissioner of Scouts Tasmania.

"As Governor I plan to continue the Rotary mission from a worldwide perspective and locally."

The theme of Mr Patten's year as Governor will be "Create Hope in the World". He hopes the community will support Rotary Tasmania's focus on empowering women and preventing domestic violence.

"From a broad perspective Rotary is aiming to be more involved in raising awareness and access to services for mental health," Mr Patton said.

"Locally we are currently focusing on funding gynaecological cancer trials and raising awareness for the consequences of domestic violence.

"It's imperative that we inform perpetrators of domestic violence that their actions are not appropriate and I'm sure this message will be received well by the community."
