

The RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness) initiative is a collaborative community effort aimed at enhancing road safety among young drivers and passengers. Conducted in partnership with Rotary and supported by corporate sponsors, the program offers practical road safety insights to youth, particularly those approaching the age of driving. Geared towards grade 10 students in Tasmania, the initiative is led by a diverse group of professionals including experts, driving instructors, road safety law enforcement officials, survivors of road accidents, and substance abuse educators. By emphasizing attitude and awareness, RYDA strives to equip students with the knowledge and mindset to become responsible and safe individuals on the road. The program spans the entire state, emphasizing the importance of road safety education.



RYDA is operating this year at the Claremont College from **Monday**, **21st August to Friday**, **8th September**. Times required are from 9am to 2pm. Morning tea, coffee/tea and lunch will be provided.

The club has been approached to provide volunteer guides to take class groups from one activity point to another. A briefing for guides will be provided before each day's activities start.

Behaviour management will be the responsibility of the teachers. RYDA activities will be the responsibility of the facilitators.



Microaggressions can cause lasting pain...


